Job Description – Lunchtime Supervisor



Job purpose: Applicants should be able to competently undertake the care, physical support, and supervision of children aged between 4 and 11 years old.

<p>Dinner Hall Responsibilities</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensuring good behaviour and calm atmosphere • Dealing with any unruly behaviour that may occur by intervention or calling for assistance, recording incidents and passing to Pastoral Lead • Support pupils, as appropriate, while they are eating their dinner. • Being aware of pupils on special or restricted diets for medical reasons • Assisting pupils with cutting up food, pouring liquids etc. where necessary • Encouraging social skills and good table manners, ensuring safety with knives and forks • Ensuring pupils tidy/clear up in a satisfactory manner • Cleaning up spillages • Dealing with any bodily spillages in the dining hall in accordance with infection control procedures • Sharing responsibility with other lunchtime supervisors and/or teachers for the maintenance of order and discipline in the dining hall area.
<p>Outdoor Play</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure pupils are adequately dressed for the all weather conditions • Direction of pupils to the playground and supervision of their activities and behaviour, ensuring their safety and wellbeing, providing emotional support where necessary • Engage in a range of play activities to motivate and enthuse pupils during their lunchtime. • Preventing behaviour issues, being aware of changes in friendships, encouraging socialising, play etc. • Discouraging any dangerous activities. • Dealing with any unacceptable or challenging behaviour • Supervision and control of pupils inside the premises when they are not allowed outside due to bad weather

Ancillary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checking toilet areas regularly for signs of blockage of toilets/wash basins and to ensure pupils are not loitering or playing in toilet areas • Reporting any damage or blockages to site supervisor • Ensuring that any pupils who suffer accident or injury are dealt with appropriately in accordance with the Academy's agreed procedures
Safeguarding Children	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tees Valley Education is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people. We expect all staff to share this commitment and to undergo appropriate checks, including enhanced DBS checks • To follow the child protection procedures adopted by the academy
Personal Skills and attributes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Excellent interpersonal skills • Have the ability to communicate effectively with both adults and children. • Successfully supervise pupils, both in the dining hall and whilst playing on the yard. • Have a good understanding of how to care for children. • Demonstrate a proven track record of working successfully as part of a team. • Flexible and adaptable, even under challenging situations • Actively promote the ethos of the academy

The job holder may be required to undertake additional duties as could be reasonably required in exceptional or emergency situations.
