




Farmer Jones did not look after his animals. The sheep were cold. The pigs were hungry.

throw it to the side of the room




Two pigs, Napoleon and Snowball were fed up. They drove Farmer Jones off the farm.




Celebration sounds on sound switch or using tambourines Clapping (gross motor)


