
- Soft toy cat

It was cold and dark and no-one was about.




Resources and Sensory Experiences

As she passed a half open door the cat could smell fried fish. Her whiskers twitched.







Coffee granules / instant coffee for café smell Piece of smooth wood



She crept inside. It was a café with low wooden tables.








A lady sat eating noodles with ginger and turmeric tofu. She gave the cat a taste.








A man sat eating fried fish with sticky rice.

He gave the cat a taste.









Another man had a bowl of spicy miso soup with strips of garlic chicken.

He gave the cat a taste.






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A lady sat at another table with a hot cup of matcha tea.


She stroked the cat and tickled it behind the ears.








The owner brought a warm blanket for the cat to curl up on.








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"You can stay here as long as you want" he said as the cat started to purr.








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And that is how Rakki became the Café Cat of Sankyo Street.
