




Persephone was the daughter of Greek gods. Her mum was Demeter, her dad was Zeus.





Flowers grew everywhere Persephone walked.

Darken room and use torches


Sombre music on sound switch

Sound switch / screen – "I'm coming home" Skylar Grey






Demeter asked Hades to let Persephone come home.


Gradually increase the light in the room
